- Please TITLE your file with your name and school.
- Posters should be 11" x 17" (portrait or landscape) in a high-resolution in JPEG format. Digital posters created with software also accepted.
- Artwork should be 300 dpi or higher.
- All text should be at least 1/2" away from the edge of the paper.
