Indicators

<i>Indicator</i>	<i>Description of indicator and calculation method</i>
One-Semester Retention Rate	Formula: total # of students from a given cohort who were still enrolled in the program one long semester (i.e. Fall or Spring) after matriculation divided by the total cohort size. For example, the Fall 2022 cohort consisted of 23 students, 22 of whom were retained one long semester later (as of the Spring 2023 semester), so the Fall 2022 cohort one-semester retention rate is $22 / 23 = 95.7\%$
One-Year Retention Rate	Formula: total # of students from a given cohort who were still enrolled in the program one year after matriculation divided by the total cohort size. For example, the Fall 2022 cohort consisted of 23 students, 22 of whom were retained one year later (as of the Fall 2023 semester), so the Fall 2022 cohort one-year retention rate is $22 / 23 = 95.7\%$
5-Year Graduation Rate	Formula: total # of students from the given cohort who graduated within five years divided by the total cohort size. For example, the Fall 2017 cohort consisted of 8 students, all of whom graduated by the end of the 2021-22 academic year, so the Fall 2017 cohort graduation rate is $8 / 8 = 100\%$
Attrition Rate	Formula: total # of students from the given cohort who did not graduate from the program within five years divided by the total cohort size. For example, the Fall 2017 cohort consisted of 8 students, all of whom graduated by the end of the 2021-22 academic year, so the Fall 2017 cohort attrition rate is $0 / 8 = 0\%$

Additional Notes:

Students who are enrolled as graduate students at the University of Houston must complete the usual master's degree program within five years of the date of enrollment with a master's degree objective at the University of Houston. The Office of Institutional Research calculates graduation rates for master's degree programs based on a five-year rate, and the attrition rate is based on the same five-year period.
